## Please Observe the Following Rules

- Obey all Danger/No Trespassing signs and barricades for safety. Do not touch items that might be discarded military munitions.
- Public use is restricted to signed roads and trails. Unmarked trails are not available for public use.
- Motorized use (vehicles, motorcycles, etc.) is prohibited.
- Shooting, hunting and possession of weapons is prohibited.
- Lands are open from 1/2 hour before sunrise to 1/2 hour after sunset.
- Campfires and fireworks are prohibited.
- Please control all dogs and clean up after them.

## Watch For our Road and Trail Signs

**Single Track**—popular for hikers and bikers. Watch your speeds and avoid when wet.
